## Code Red Day Tomorrow Means Free Bus Rides on N. Virginia Routes

It's that time of year again...
The Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (MWCOG) has issued a bad air alert for tomorrow, Tuesday, June 25th. Ozone levels are predicted to be extremely high and air quality very poor.

In a region-wide effort to encourage citizens to drive less during the summer and help the region stay within federal clean air standards, bus service providers in Northern Virginia will suspend fare collection tomorrow and any other days declared by MWCOG to be Code Red. Funding for this free fare project is provided through a federal transportation grant obtained by the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (VDRPT) for the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission (NVTC).
