## NVTC JANUARY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE USE OF I-66 TOLL MONEY FOR RAIL PROJECTS, A LETTER EXPRESSING CONCERNS OVER WMATA'S PROPOSED BUDGET, INSTALLATION OF NEW OFFICERS AND COMMISSIONERS

#### The Commission will also hear public comments on the NVTC 2020-2021 Work Plan

Arlington, Va. - The Northern Virginia Transportation Commission will hold its monthly meeting on Thursday, January 16. The Commission will be asked to give final approval for a proposal to modify an existing agreement in order to free up money to support the Long Bridge passenger rail improvement project. Commissioners will also be asked to approve a letter addressing concerns with WMATA's FY2021 budget. On the operations side, NVTC will appoint new officers for 2020 and swear-in four new Commissioners and one alternate. Additionally, NVTC will hold it's annual public comment period.

#### MODIFICATION OF INSIDE THE BELTWAY AGREEMENT

The Commission will be asked to approve amendments to the 2017 Amended and Restated Transform66 Inside the Beltway <u>Memorandum of Agreement</u> (MOA). The changes would allow the Commonwealth to use revenues for debt service and pay-go expenses for rail transit capital improvements; provide funding guarantees for the Commuter Choice program; and provide greater flexibility for funding transit operations. The proposed changes align with Gov. Ralph Northam's <u>announcement</u> last month of a plan to build a passenger rail bridge across the Potomac River and purchase railroad right of way in Virginia, which would allow for a significant expansion of VRE and Amtrak service in the Commonwealth.

#### LETTER TO WMATA

The Commission will be asked to authorize the Chair to submit comments to WMATA on its FY2021 Budget. A <u>letter</u> drafted by the NVTC WMATA Committee concludes the FY2021 budget does not appear to exceed Virginia's legislatively required 3% cap, but there are concerns that the budget does not find the right balance between fare increases, Metrobus service cuts and new initiatives to increase ridership.

#### NEW NVTC LEADERSHIP AND COMMISSIONERS

Commissioners will be asked to approve a new slate of officers for 2020. The NVTC Executive Committee recommends the following

- Chair: Katie Cristol from Arlington County
- Vice-Chair: Canek Aguirre from the City of Alexandria
- Secretary-Treasurer: Jeff McKay from Fairfax County

In addition, NVTC will swear-in new Commissioners and one alternate:

- Dalia Palchik from Fairfax County\*
- James Walkinshaw from Fairfax County\*

- Daniel G. Storck (alternate) from Fairfax County\*
- Michael Turner from Loudoun County

The Virginia General Assembly will appoint one member from the Senate and three members from the House of Delegates later in the 2020 session.
