NORTHERN VIRGINIA TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION CELEBRATES 50 YEARS OF TRANSIT INNOVATION ON SEPTEMBER 4, 2014

NVTC will honor the accomplishments of Transportation Leaders and Innovators

Arlington, VA— The Northern Virginia Transportation Commission (NVTC) will celebrate 50 years of Transit Innovation at George Mason University's Founders Hall on September 4, 2014. The 50th Anniversary celebration will include special tributes to retiring U.S. Representatives James P. Moran (D-8th) and Frank Wolf (R-10th) for their support of the region's transit systems. Rep. Moran served on the commission from 1985-1990 and as its Chairman in 1988 and 1990.

Virginia Transportation Secretary Aubrey Layne will join Members of Congress, current and past commissioners, Members of the Virginia General Assembly, and transportation leaders from across the region to celebrate NVTC's accomplishments in bringing the region together to build and expand Northern Virginia's transit network.

"NVTC brings the region together to make transit work for Virginians, its businesses, and visitors to the Commonwealth and the Nation's Capital," said **Virginia Transportation Secretary Aubrey Layne**. "We are committed to making sure that transit connects people to work and businesses to employees and customers."

"We will celebrate how NVTC brings the region together to work for transit including Metro and VRE, local and commuter buses, and even the region's first Bus Rapid Transit service which opened for business just a week and a half ago," said NVTC **Chairman Paul Smedberg**. "I am excited that as we celebrate our history, we will also look to the future by launching several new partnerships with business, transportation research organizations and government."

Did You Know?

- > 76% of all transit trips in the Commonwealth of Virginia are in NoVA a total of 156M transit trips annually
- Virginia now has 52.47 miles of Metrorail & 25 Metrorail stations in Virginia
- > VRE now operates 30 trains, 111 railcars, 16 stations in Virginia (18 overall) and 90 miles of track
- Metrobus now has 335 routes and 15,000 bus stops throughout the region
