

6. Revisions to the NVTC Electronic Participation Policy

ACTION ITEM: Approve Revisions to the NVTC Electronic Participation policy to Align with Current Law

- ✓ Incorporates changes in the Freedom of Information Act Code language (<u>HB 1931 (Levine</u>)) which will become effective July 1, 2021:
 - Adds an allowable circumstance if a member is unable to attend the meeting due to a family member's medical condition.
 - Electronic participation is limited to two meetings per calendar year <u>OR</u> 25% of the meetings, whichever is greater.
- ✓ Adds language regarding electronic participation during a local declared state of emergency (<u>SB 1271 (McPike)</u>).
