





Zero-Fare and Reduced Fare Options for Northern Virginia Transit Operators

- ✓ Northern Virginia has a unique transit environment that provides both opportunities and challenges for new fare programs.
- ✓ There are benefits for ridership growth after eliminating fares.
- ✓ Reduced-fare programs can result in a **net cost** increase.
- ✓ Full systemwide zero-fare options can reduce fare collection costs, but other capital and operating costs may increase.
- ✓ Funding is available to help establish these types of fare programs, but long-term sustainable revenue replacement sources are needed.
- ✓ Zero- and reduced-fare programs underway in Virginia are opportunities to watch and learn.
